JOHNSON COUNTY 4-H HORSE PROJECT REQUIREMENTS

To receive a **Horse Project Completion Certificate**, the following requirements must be met:

- 1. The 4-H Club requirements to be a member in good standing must be met (attendance, participation, etc.).
- 2. The Horse Project Record Form for the current year must be turned in by May 1 to the Extension Office or WildRider's club manager. Forms will be available on johnsoncountyhorse.com or from WildRider's club leader.
- 3. By May 1 of current year, members with a horse must participate in two off-horse clinics, one hands-on clinic and exhibit at one horse show. Members without a horse must have participated in four off-horse activities including judging events, horse bowl, hippology, mini clinics held by clubs or by volunteering at a Johnson County 4-H Horse Show.

Requirements to Qualify for Travel Allowance for District and/or State Show:

- 1. Member must participate in 2 of 4 Spring Horse Shows or request an individual variance in writing from the JCHC. (Futurity horses should be shown but do not have to place in spring shows)
- 2. Must meet 4-H Horse Project requirements; and a Horse Project Form must be submitted to the Extension Office or Club manager by May 1, complete with required signatures and club manager approval.
- 3. Horse(s) must be validated online, according to 4-H rules by the required date set by 4-H, including fees and required papers and pictures. (It is suggested to validate all horses in the event a horse is injured or cannot compete, there are other horses validated which may be used)
- 4. Member must be 4-H age (completed at least 3rd grade) and not a Clover Kid.
- 5. Questions can be clarified by the club manager but the JC HC has the final decision if requirements have been met for travel allowance.
